### Transitions...on to pastures new...

Hello, I'm Rachael, the new Education Transitions Worker at Castle Park. This term it's been wonderful to meet the team, learn the ropes and most importantly get to know the students! As part of our transitional support, I've accompanied students on a number of college visits, including Coleg Cambria -Yale Campus, Northop, Reaseheath and Cheshire S&W - Handbridge and Ellesmere Port Campuses. We've also supported the transition into Ancora through home visits and school sessions.

We're very lucky to have the support of The Cheshire and Warrington Pledge, who help us to link with employers and careers to widen our students' experiences and develop transferrable skills. Before the summer break we have had a Virtual Work Experience Workshop with our Year 10 students, where they took part in a hospitality project set by Brunning &Price. They successfully planned a wedding and did a great job keeping within the budget! Last week we were invited to Chester Zoo, where a number of our students joined the Conservation tour and careers exhibition. Our first ever NHS Insights Day over at The Countess of Chester Hospital also took place. This was a great opportunity to explore careers within the NHS and gain some experience of the workplace.

Plans have already been made for the next academic year, to ensure we provide a wide range of career opportunities for our students. This includes visits to the Careers Fair and Jobs and Apprenticeships fair; talks from a number of independent training providers and continuing our links with local organisations, businesses and voluntary services. We are also really excited to be involved in a new Needs-Led Mentoring programme, for our Year 11 and Post 16 students to guide them with CV writing, interview techniques and transferrable skills.






## In English this half term...




<u>The Hunger Games</u>: The young people will be analysing and exploring the text in depth, considering: characterisation, setting and plot development. With the skills that they have identified and analysed, students will then be developing their creative writing skills.





Goodbye, KS4 & 5: The KS4 and 5 students have successfully sat their English and Functional Skills Exam's and have worked considerably hard in the build up to these. We wish them all of the best for the future!







<u>Literacy:</u> The young people have engaged in a range of literacy projects, ranging from: Crystals, Guitar hero's and a history of Merseyrail; to creating a new planet. The projects have engaged the students and allowed them to hone their literacy skills.

## In Art this half term.

In KS3 we have looked at the work of Jae Kim, an artist who makes doughnuts to represent the variety of cultures and ethnicities, and made our own interpretations.

We have studied Hannah Bullen who create birds from found flora and fauna.

GCSE students have continued to work on their insect and butterfly studies in preparation for their surface pattern designs.







## In Science this half term.

Painted Lady Butterflies (Vanesa Cardi)

These beautiful creatures are called painted lady butterflies which we have been looking after at school since they were caterpillars. We have watched them develop through the different stages of metamorphosis, from caterpillar to chrysalis to butterfly. After we released them, they will live for 2 weeks eating nectar from thistles and other nectar rich wild plants. Those that are around in the Autumn will migrate to North Africa for the winter and return to the UK in May to lay their eggs. The painted lady butterflies are pretty gorgeous insects and it was lovely to learn about them and watch them develop.



## In PSHE this half term.
